



2. Dividend

Your Directors have deemed it prudent not to recommend any dividend on equity shares for the year ended 31st March, 2012, in order to conserve the resources for the future years.

3. Review of Operations

Your Company has recorded a very good performance during the year under review. Inclusive of Income by way of Dividend of Rs.2,172.69 Lacs, Interest of Rs.997.92 Lacs, and Pledge Fees of Rs. 37.37 Lacs, the Total Income is Rs. 3,207.98 Lacs as against Total Income of Rs.2,406.63 Lacs in the previous year. The Profit before depreciation and tax is Rs.2,983.73 Lacs. After providing for depreciation of Rs. 0.10 Lacs and Tax of Rs.315.39 Lacs, the Net Profit is Rs.2,668.24 Lacs as against Rs.2,070.31 Lacs in the previous year, an increase of around 29%.

An amount of Rs. 533.65 Lacs was transferred to Statutory Reserve Fund pursuant to Section 45-IC of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934, during the financial year under review. The provision of Rs. 5.99 Lacs for Standard Assets has been made during the financial year in terms of Notification No. DNBS.222/CGM(US)-2011 dated 17.01.2011 issued by Reserve Bank of India.

4. Future Prospects

Your Company continues to hold significant investments in Equity Shares of JSW Steel Limited besides certain other Investments in other O. P. Jindal Group of Companies. The financial year under review saw improvement in the economy. The Steel Sector in India also is on the growth path and

the performance of the Investee Companies are expected to substantially improve in the current financial year, which would result is higher dividend payouts in the coming year. The anticipated infrastructure development being undertaken in the country is expected to give a further boost to the Steel industry and your Company is looking forward for a sustainable growth in its Investee Companies in the coming year which would restore the shareholders' value.

The Company will continue to focus on making long-term strategic investments in various New Ventures promoted by JSW Group, a part of O. P. Jindal Group, besides consolidating the existing investments through further investments in the existing companies. Considering the further forecasted growth in the economy and the prospects of the economy as a whole and the steel industry in particular, the Company expects to restore its entrenched value with a hope of further enhancement in the long term for the benefit of the shareholders at large.

Your Company has neither any holding company nor a subsidiary company.

6. Fixed Deposits

Your Company has neither accepted nor renewed any deposits within the meaning of Section 58A of the Companies Act, 1956 and the rules made there under.

The proposal regarding their re-appointment as Directors is placed for your approval.

M/s. Shah Gupta & Co., Chartered Accountants, Mumbai, Statutory Auditors of the Company retire at the conclusion of the ensuing Annual General Meeting and being eligible, offer themselves for re-appointment. The Company has received confirmation that their appointment, if made, would be within the limits prescribed under Section 224(1B) of the Companies Act, 1956, and that they are not disqualified for such appointment within the meaning of Section 226 of the Companies Act, 1956. Your Directors recommend re-appointment of M/s. Shah Gupta & Co. as the Statutory Auditors of the Company for the current financial year and fixation of their remuneration.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Overview - Financial Performance

The Company during the Financial Year 2011-12 has posted a very good financial performance. Inclusive of Income by way of Dividend of Rs.2,172.69 Lacs, Interest of Rs.997.92 Lacs, and Pledge Fees of Rs. 37.37 Lacs, the Total Income is Rs. 3,207.98 Lacs as against Total Income of Rs.2,406.63 Lacs in the previous year. The Profit before depreciation and tax is Rs.2,983.73 Lacs. After providing for depreciation of Rs. 0.10 Lacs and Tax of Rs.315.39 Lacs, the Net Profit is Rs.2,668.24 Lacs as against Rs.2,070.31 Lacs in the previous year, an increase of around 29%. The Share Capital of the Company as on 31st March, 2012 stood at Rs.11.10 crores and Reserves and Surplus at Rs.658.36 crores resulting in Net worth of Rs.669.46 crores.

Outlook

Major activities and Future Prospects

The Company is registered as a Non Banking Financial Company (NBFC) with Reserve Bank of India under the provisions of Section 45 IA of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934. In terms of Non-Banking Financial (Non-Deposit Accepting or Holding) Companies Prudential Norms (Reserve Bank) Directions, 2007, the Company is a 'Systemically Important Non-Deposit Taking Non-Banking Financial Company' (i.e a Non-Banking Financial Company not accepting / holding public deposits and having an asset size of more than Rs.100 crores) having total assets of Rs.670.55 crores.

Your Company continues to hold significant investments in Equity Shares of JSW Steel Limited besides certain other Investments in other O. P. Jindal Group of Companies. The financial year under review saw improvement in the economy. The Steel Sector in India is also on the growth path and the performance of the Investee Companies are expected to substantially improve in the current financial year, which would result is higher dividend payouts in the coming year. The anticipated infrastructure development being undertaken in the country is expected to give a further boost to the Steel industry and your Company is looking forward for a sustainable growth in its Investee Companies in the coming year which would enhance the shareholders' value.

The Company will continue to focus on making long-term strategic investments in various New Ventures promoted by JSW Group, a part of O. P. Jindal Group, besides consolidating the existing investments through further investments in the existing companies. Considering the further forecasted growth in the economy and the prospects of the economy as a whole and the steel industry in particular, the Company expects to restore its

Opportunities & Threats

Considering that the economy on the whole is again on the path of growth, the Company foresees a lot of opportunities coming up for equity participation in new projects/expansion of existing projects of the Investee Companies in the future. The Company can also explore other opportunities in the Capital market, which may come up.

The Company holds significant investments in equity of Steel Companies. The Steel industry is characterized by cyclical fluctuations in prices. Downward movement in the Steel prices could adversely affect margins of the Steel Companies, which could be a major threat to the Company's fortunes.

Risk and Concerns

The Company is mainly exposed to market risks in the form of reduction in value of its investments and fall in returns due to dip in the Investee Company's performance. The Company is also exposed to the fluctuations of economy and industry cycles/downturns.

Internal Control Systems

The Company has adequate internal control systems for the business processes in respect of all operations, financial reporting, compliance with laws and regulations etc. The Management Information System forms an effective and sound tool for monitoring and controlling all operating parameters. Regular internal audits ensure that responsibilities are executed effectively. The Audit Committee reviews the Internal Audit Reports and the adequacy of internal controls on regular basis.

Human Resources Management

The Company presently has 2 employees who are professionals in their field and are given independent responsibilities to perform significant roles in the Company's development. The Company will strengthen its operative staff as and when the need arises.



Note 15

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND OTHER NOTES FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

I. Accounting Policies:

(a) General

(i) The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in India (Indian GAAP). The Company has prepared these financial statements to comply in all material respects with the accounting standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, (as amended) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention.

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of financial statements are consistent with those of previous year.

- (ii) The Company follows mercantile system of accounting and recognizes Income & Expenditure on accrual basis except dividend, which is accounted when the right to receive the same is established, and those with significant uncertainties and in accordance with the applicable accounting standards.
- (iii) All the assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule VI to the Companies Act, 1956. Based on the nature of business operations, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current—non current classification of assets and liabilities.
- (iv) Advances are classified as "Performing Assets" and "Non Performing Assets" as per the directions issued by the Reserve Bank of India. Provision for Advances is made as per the directions issued by the Reserve Bank of India.

(b) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost of acquisition, including any attributable cost for bringing the assets to its working conditions for its intended use, less accumulated depreciation.

(c) Depreciation

The Company provides depreciation on assets on the written down value method on pro-rata basis at the rates prescribed in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956.

(d) Non-current Investments

Non-current Investments are stated at cost. In case, there is a diminution in the value of investments other than temporary in nature, a provision for the same is made in the accounts.

(e) Employee Benefits

(i) Provident Fund is a defined contribution scheme and the contributions are charged to the Statement of Profit & Loss of the year when the contributions to the respective funds are due.

- (ii) Gratuity liability are defined benefit obligations and are provided for on the basis of an actuarial valuation as per AS 15 (Revised) made at the end of each financial year based on the projected unit credit method.
- (iii) Long term compensated absences are provided for based on actuarial valuation.
- (iv) Actuarial gains/losses are immediately taken to the Statement of Profit and Loss and are not deferred.

(f) Earnings per Share

The Company reports basic and diluted Earnings per share (EPS) in accordance with Accounting Standard - 20 on "Earnings per Share". Basic EPS is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the year by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted EPS is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the year by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year as adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares, except where the results are anti-dilutive.

(g) Taxes on Income

Current tax is determined as the amount of tax payable in respect of taxable income for the year in accordance with the Income Act, 1961.

The deferred tax for timing difference between the book and tax profits for the year is accounted for, using the tax rates and laws that have been substantively enacted as of the Balance Sheet date. Deferred tax assets arising from timing differences are recognized to the extent there is reasonable certainty that this would be realized in future.

(h) Impairment of Fixed Assets

Consideration is given at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment of the carrying amount of the Company's fixed assets. If any indication exists, an asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognized whenever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is greater of the net selling price and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value based on an appropriate discount factor.

(i) Contingent Liabilities

The Company creates a provision when there is a present obligation as a result of a past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require outflow of resources. When there is a possible obligation or present obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

(j) Stock Based Compensation

The compensation cost of stock options granted to employees is calculated using the intrinsic value of the stock options. The compensation expense is amortized uniformly over the vesting period of the option.

II. Other Notes forming part of Financial Statements

- In the opinion of the Management, the current assets and other non-current assets have a value on realization in the ordinary course of business, at least equal to the amount at which they are stated in the Balance Sheet. Provision for all known liabilities is adequate and not in excess of what is required.


